History

ON JULY 1, 2009, "INDEPENDENCE DAY," A NEW CHAPTER WAS UNVEILED

Saint Anthony Hospital is a landmark on Chicago's west and southwest sides. Our service to the health care needs of the hardworking families of the community surpasses 110 years. Saint Anthony Hospital was operated by the Franciscan Sisters for many years, from the time of its founding in 1897. The Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus Stella Maris Province assumed sponsorship in 1993. Two years later, the Missionary Sisters partnered with the Daughters of Charity to form an entity called Catholic Health Partners.

On July 1, 2009, after many months of planning and negotiation, Saint Anthony Hospital became an independent facility, separating from Ascension Health, the nation's largest Catholic and nonprofit health system, which it had been part of since 2002 as well as the Missionary Sisters.

Catholic Hospitals need to have sponsors of some kind; usually, these sponsors are large Catholic health care organizations. However, Saint Anthony Hospital is doing it differently; a special board called a Public Juridic Person, which allows the Hospital to remain Catholic, now governs it. Saint Anthony Hospital is one of the first freestanding Hospitals in the country to receive permission to operate in this manner.

"The step that Saint Anthony Hospital has taken is an innovative one," says Cardinal Francis George, O.M.I., Archbishop of Chicago. "We're happy that Saint Anthony Hospital remains a Catholic Hospital. It is doing important work in providing excellent care for underserved communities."

In the Community

COMMUNITY SERVICES: EMBRACING THE NEIGHBORHOODS WE SERVE

A community is defined as "a social group of any size whose members reside in a specific locality, share government and have a common cultural and historical heritage."

While the explanation above is correct and comprehensive, it doesn't convey the powerful pull of what community *really* is, what it feels like and how it impacts every person who is part of its circle.

At Saint Anthony Hospital, we value our community leadership role as well as our reputation as a place where local residents receive health care services delivered with a personal touch in a culturally comfortable environment. Our commitment: to serve as a place where important health information is shared, common problems discussed and celebrations marked.

In fiscal year 2009 (July 1, 2008 – June 30, 2009), our "Hospital without walls," connected with our community by reaching out to our neighbors wherever they live, work and play. For example:

- A Church Nurse Program provided a specialized practice of professional nursing that focuses on the intentional care of the whole person while integrating faith and health. The emphasis is on healthy spirituality, disease prevention, health promotion and advocacy with compassion.

- Health fairs and a range of health screenings were offered year-round. Locations of these events were wide-ranging, from churches and schools to banks and other community organizations.
- More than 1,000 people attended our popular SummerFest celebration in June. It provided an ideal opportunity to raise awareness of a variety of health issues and provide free health screenings. Offerings included blood pressure, weight/body mass index, blood typing, glucose and cholesterol testing. The event also featured a diverse selection of food, live entertainment, carnival games, prizes and a deluxe Car and Bike Show.

- Other important initiatives: a *School Wellness* program in which Saint Anthony Hospital partnered with local schools to encourage healthy habits and combat growing problems such as obesity; *Healthy Beginnings*, offering essential education and support to pregnant women and families with young children; *Mental Health Services*, which provides counseling to underserved people; and *Public Benefits and Referral Services*, linking families and individuals to health insurance, public benefits and community resources.

MONTH-BY-MONTH HIGHLIGHTS

July: Hospital associates and physicians joined in a celebration at the Second Annual Family Picnic at Brookfield Zoo. The leadership of Saint Anthony Hospital introduced the event to display its gratitude for the hard work, commitment and dedication of associates and physicians — efforts that are the backbone of the success of Saint Anthony Hospital.

July



October: For the second consecutive year, the Hospital partnered with The National Museum of Mexican Art in a successful blood drive.

January: A *School at Work Program* debuted at Saint Anthony Hospital to address the need for an increasingly skilled workforce at all levels — particularly in a culturally diverse health care environment. The successful initiative helps retain a loyal workforce, enhance associate skills and contributes to superior patient care.

February: During Heart Health Month, weekly "Red Bag Luncheons" were hosted at the Hospital, partnering with the American Heart Association and its "Go Red for Women" Campaign. Many of the 200 participants scheduled follow-up appointments with Saint Anthony Hospital physicians to obtain a "Healthy Heart Check-up" at an affordable cost.

April: Saint Anthony Hospital collaborated with the National Museum of Mexican Art to present an exhibit titled, "The African Presence in Mexico." The artwork was the focal point for a teen forum directed to Latino and African-American teens. The event helped the teens explore the many commonalities within the Latino and African-American communities.

May: Saint Anthony Hospital was awarded a \$75,000 grant from the Chicagoland area affiliate of Susan G. Komen for the Cure. Monies were used to fund *Women Together Breast Screening*, a project designed to reduce the racial and ethnic disparity related to breast cancer.

More than 35 community leaders from different denominations participated in the forum, which focused on the North and South Lawndale neighborhoods that border Saint Anthony Hospital's location.

VOLUNTEERISM CREATES A COMMUNITY OF CARING, LEARNING AND COMMITMENT

Volunteer work is the ultimate win-win situation. When people offer their time and talents to help patients and others, they greatly enhance the "care experience" by delivering the special touch, personal attention and focus on individual needs that can transform the quality of a patient's experience with Saint Anthony Hospital.

A steady group of adult volunteers also share their skills with Saint Anthony Hospital. The Hospital also attracts some of its own current and retired associates as volunteers.

Over the past year, through enhanced outreach to schools and other organizations, an increased number of youth volunteers made themselves known throughout our busy Hospital. For several years, we've partnered with nearby Spry Community Links High School to recruit "junior volunteers." And, over this past summer, we launched a successful Summer Teen Volunteer Program targeted to the children of Saint Anthony Hospital associates as well as other local youth.

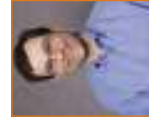

Medical Accomplishments

NEW EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT TOPS LIST OF QUALITY ENHANCEMENTS

2009 was a memorable year for Saint Anthony Hospital in every way, including a number of patient-care achievements. Topping the list: A new Emergency Department was unveiled in December 2008 featuring greatly enhanced technology and totaling 6,600 square-feet, a substantial increase from the previous 3,200 square-feet. As a result of the new facility, Saint Anthony Hospital is better equipped than ever to serve its growing population. Fifty percent of patients treated in the Emergency Department are children, far higher than the national average. Saint Anthony Hospital is one of only 26 Hospitals in Illinois certified by the State of Illinois as "Emergency Department Approved for Pediatrics." In addition, the Saint Anthony Hospital Pediatric Department is certified as "intermediate," validating its expertise beyond the level of most such departments (typically ranked as "general").

Many recent improvements are evident at Saint Anthony Hospital. For example, over the past year, several key programs have been added or enhanced, including:

- The Hospital's Diabetes Center is more highly focused than ever on: educating people about diabetes, preventing the disease, and providing optimal treatments. Diabetes is a critical problem in the communities served by Saint Anthony Hospital. Hispanics are 1.5 times more likely than non-Hispanic Caucasians to have Type 2 diabetes. African-Americans are 1.6 times more likely to have diabetes as non-Hispanic Caucasians.
- A Pain Management Center opened in October 2008. Pain affects more Americans than diabetes, heart disease and cancer combined, according to the American Pain Foundation.
- The Deformity Correction Center, a treatment area focused on complex congenital or acquired foot and ankle conditions in adults and children, opened to provide specialized, advanced patient care. The Center specializes in reconstructive orthopedic foot and ankle surgery and a variety of complex foot and ankle conditions.
- Programs are in place to heighten communications among health care providers – all to provide a safe level of care. For example, the Safe Beginnings Program in Obstetrics/Gynecology employs a proven model to

PLAZA GRILL BECOMES POPULAR LOCALE FOR HOME COOKING AND HOSPITALITY

SAINT ANTHONY HOSPITAL FOUNDATION: LAYING THE GROUNDWORK FOR GIVING

Saint Anthony Hospital continued to enhance its relationships with those who value the work we undertake in providing medical care and community support to some of Chicago's most underserved neighborhoods. The Saint Anthony Hospital Foundation, a 501(c)(3) organization, advances the interests and the commitment of Saint Anthony Hospital, as well as its ability to provide the best possible service to patients and to the community. We solicit support from individuals, corporations and foundations.

In FY 09, the Foundation was engaged in the following activities:

- A total of \$24,407 in annual charitable donations was received from the associates, physicians, businesses, private individuals and board members
- \$237,956 in grants was received from: the Catholic Bishop of Chicago; Eleanor Foundation; The Irving Harris Foundation; Midwest Generation, LLC; Illinois Coalition for Immigrants and Refugees; Susan G. Komen Breast

- Cancer Foundation; Kraft Employee Fund of Chicago; Steans Family Foundation; University of Illinois at Chicago – Pediatrics; University of Michigan – Dearborn and Washington Square Health Foundation. These funds are used to support Saint Anthony Hospitals Community Wellness Programs, Women Together Breast Screening Project and the Workforce Development Program (which funded the debut year of the highly successful *School at Work Program*).
- Saint Anthony Hospital Foundation sponsored its third Annual Golf Outing in September, 2008. The \$77,000-plus raised at the successful event went towards the purchase of two patient transportation vehicles. Through the acquisition of these vehicles, Saint Anthony Hospital is better able to meet the needs of the individuals it serves by offering safe, convenient and timely transportation to and from medical appointments.

- The Foundation awarded scholarships from the Ia Boikan Nurse Scholarship Fund to three Saint Anthony Hospital associates pursuing nursing degrees. The amount awarded was \$5,250.
- Scholarships also were awarded from the Blanche Gallagher Fund to three high school students at Our Lady of Tepeyac High School who volunteer at The Saint Anthony Hospital Community Wellness Program. The amount given was \$4,500.

We express our gratitude to all who support The Saint Anthony Hospital Foundation — at any financial level. We know that there are many worthy organizations in Chicago in need of financial assistance. Your belief in us is gratefully acknowledged.
